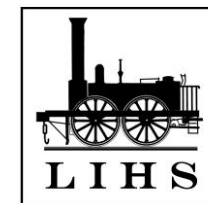
**Leicestershire Industrial History Society**

The Society is currently excavating and recording the former coal mine site (Alabama) at Swannington. You are welcome to visit the site during today's conference and on working days, normally the second Tuesday in the month.

In the autumn a NEW programme of monthly meetings relating to industrial history will commence on October 27<sup>th</sup> 2009 at the Riverside Community College which can be easily accessed from the M1/ M69 interchange.
